20 enthusiastic volunteers staffed the Halve Waste Depot. 54 bins that were sorted were consolidated into 35 bins of which only 4 were landfill. There were18 bins of recyclable material, 2 bins of aluminium cans provided to Yackandandah Scouts and 2 bins of soft plastics for recycling through the RedCycle bin in Chiltern. 9 bins of compostable material have since been shredded for use in the Community Garden.
