WATCH attendance at Climate Action Network Australia (CANA) conference

Three WATCH members, Lizette, Lauriston and Jenny, attended Melbourne's two day CANA conference in mid-March. This was a valuable opportunity to meet, share and learn from fellow grassroots campaigners and Australia's top environmental NGOs. High on the agenda for all groups this year is a concerted push to 'close coal'. Australia currently produces a massive 9,000MW of excess electricity - the equivalent of six coal-burning power stations. We can't ramp up renewables unless we start closing coal-burning power stations. This is a key message every one of us must share far and wide.

Are we using the right lingo?

The words we use to discuss climate change can have a powerful impact. Latest research from the Australian Conservation Foundation and Climate Media Centre tells us that we should:

- Talk about 'pollution', not 'emissions/greenhouse gas emissions' ('pollution' is a much stronger frame).
- Refer to 'coal' rather than 'fossil fuels' (many people still don't understand 'fossil fuels')
- Talk about 'destruction of our planet' or 'damage to climate' rather than 'climate change'.
- Engage and strengthen people's deeper values by using words and phrases such as 'empathy', 'community',
 'beauty of the natural world', 'justice' and 'responsibility'.
