Please bring your letter about Adani to hand-deliver to her office. We'll have letter templates available, but personalised ones would be great. Included below are some guidelines and core messages that you could use to write your letter to Sussan:

- Mention why you are so concerned about the mine
- Add some information about your background e.g. work or family situation.
- Avoid personal attacks.
- Keep the message broad and focussed on the depth and breadth of community opposition to this project due to serious concerns about the future of the Great Barrier Reef and our already warming climate.
