Almost 20 people from the Albury-Wodonga region attended the Climate Emergency Summit in Melbourne last weekend, joining a huge audience in the Town Hall to listen to an impressive line-up of speakers. A key message was that we have the technology to achieve zero net emissions within ten years if we treat this problem as a national security issue, akin to mobilising for war. Market forces alone will be too slow to get us there, so we must persuade our governments, which can only happen if we engage more of the community.
