Climate messaging

If you want to engage people who are unsure about climate change, you must use relentlessly positive messages e.g. Australia is a clever country, we developed wifi and we have the know-how to roll out renewable energy, which will create jobs (etc etc). If you combine fear (of a climate crisis) with tangible climate actions, giving people a sense of efficacy, that's fine. But painting a negative picture of the future, with fear messages alone, will lead to fatalistic behaviours; people turning off and continuing live as they always have, possibly living it up even more, because 'what the heck, we're doomed anyway'.
