Environmental activists in the dark as government refuses, delays access to information

Federal government agencies are refusing in full or in part the vast majority of requests for environment-related documents under freedom of information law in what the Australian Conservation Foundation says is a trend to secrecy that is threatening the country's ecosystems. Food for thought

News Corp produces and amplifies climate scepticism

<u>Lies, Debates, and Silences: How News Corp produces climate scepticism in Australia</u> is an explosive new report, commissioned by GetUp, that reveals the staggering levels of climate scepticism peddled by major News Corp newspapers. It found that 45% of all News Corp climate coverage expressed scepticism in the reality of climate change. 65% of opinion pieces were sceptical towards climate science. Of the 55% of stories that accepted climate science, there was negligible reporting of the findings of climate scientists or the impacts of climate change.
